PUBLISH AND FLOURISH

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Managing Time

- Differentiate the "urgent" from the important
- Write daily
- Record time spent writing daily an share records weekly with a mentor

Writing

- Write from the first day of your research project
- Post your work on the wall and write to it

Revising

- Organize around key sentences
- Use key sentences as an outline

Getting Help

- Share early drafts with non-experts and later drafts with experts
- Learn how to listen
- Respond to every specific comment

Polishing and Letting Go

- Read your prose out loud
- Kick the proposal/dissertation/article out the door and make them say "No."
